
19 Years of Innovation

In 2007, CSU Global received a \$12 million loan from the CSU System to become the first statutorily defined, non-profit, online state university that does not receive state funding in the United States. We opened our (virtual) doors in 2008, welcoming our first class of 200 students, and paid back the loan with interest in 2012 – years ahead of schedule. Colorado Governor Bill Ritter declared CSU Global an independent online university within the Colorado State University System in 2009, and in 2010, Dr. Becky Takeda-Tinker was appointed CSU Global's first official president and CEO. Since the Higher Learning Commission granted Colorado State University Global full accreditation in 2011, and now through 2025-26, the University has gone on to innovate career-specific degree and certificate programs. The University embeds industry-aligned education and professional examination preparation in appropriate courses to help working adults keep up with

increasingly faster-changing industry trends. By partnering with business and thought leaders, and hiring faculty and academic leaders with industry work expertise and experience, CSU Global continually strives to stay ahead of business trends and practices and align its curricula with industry certifications and licensures.

To date, CSU Global has graduated more than 39,600 students – proud Golden Eagles working in industries from education to technology, breaking barriers and uplifting entire generations of families and organizations across the world. As we look to the future, CSU Global remains committed to its mission of advancing professionals in the workplace and will continue to lead the way in delivering high-quality online programs into the future.


CSU Global offers several institutional scholarships to students each trimester and provides access to hundreds more via ScholarshipUniverse.



Undergraduate Student Profile

Amanda Boothroyd never thought college was in the cards for her. Battling health issues throughout her life made furthering her education seem impossible. "When I was 13, I was diagnosed with a tumor on my salivary gland," Boothroyd shared. "When I had surgery to have it removed, the liquid spilled inside, so I've had several surgeries throughout my life. I had to travel a lot of the time to receive care. College was never something I thought I would be able to do; my health was more important at the time, so that's what I had to focus on."

After high school, Boothroyd knew she wanted to work in healthcare to help people. She got her CNA certification at a local community college, however, over time, the job began to wear on her. "My own experience helped me to really connect with the people I served, but I had to prepare many of them for the end of their life and as I started to lose patients, it became too much; I started bringing work home with me," Boothroyd explained.

About six months into working at a new company, Boothroyd was invited to a corporate company meeting in Texas. She booked her very first flight there and took part in various meetings, including a Women's Leadership panel. "The women who spoke all had different stories to share; one of them had a story like mine and she had battled health issues throughout her life," Boothroyd stated. **"After being inspired by these women's stories, I decided right then and there that I wanted more and I wanted to grow. I wanted to impact peoples' lives the way these women had impacted me."** Two weeks later, Boothroyd enrolled as a student in the Organizational Leadership program at CSU Global.

Balancing going back to school, working full-time, traveling for healthcare, being a mom, and traveling for work proved to be challenging for Boothroyd, but she was up to the task because of CSU Global. "I'll be honest, if I wasn't able to be an online student with CSU Global, college wouldn't be a possibility for me," Boothroyd shared. "The flexibility of an online schedule is crucial for me."

Once her classes began, Boothroyd's confidence grew as a result of support she received from her instructors. **"When I first enrolled at CSU Global, I signed up for a math class and I was so scared,"** Boothroyd commented. **"I'll be honest, I never had good grades in high school. But the support here has been amazing! It's like CSU Global had students like me in mind, people with full-time jobs, parents, people who have been out of school for a long time, etc., and they designed a program to make sure we succeed."**

Although some people may say that college is not worth it, Boothroyd emphasized her education has been valuable. "People tell you all the time, 'Don't go to college, you don't need it, it's so expensive and a waste of time,' but I tell them my experience has been the opposite!" Boothroyd shared. "I have learned and evolved so much since going back to school. I have learned things that I've been able to apply in the workplace, in my relationships, and I've just learned so many things that help me in my daily life."

A resident of Des Moines, Iowa, Boothroyd mentioned how it has been fulfilling to take classes with students from all over the globe. "A student in my U.S. history class was from another country – it was so fascinating to hear her perspectives and learn about her culture along the way," she said. "It was neat to see how truly global the community is."

Boothroyd is set to graduate from CSU Global with her B.S. in Organizational Leadership in early 2027. She is excited to keep learning, evolving and growing. "If you're not willing to change, then you're not willing to grow," she shared. "Those two things go hand in hand."

Xue "Alice" Dong

CSU Global graduate

Xue "Alice" Dong, CSU Global graduate, is using her Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning degree to give back to others. After discovering a need within rural farming communities, Dong took it upon herself to create an AI-powered agritourism toolkit.

"The idea grew out of my direct work with the rural communities in the eastern region," Dong shared. "I saw that there were some recurring challenges faced by small and mid-size agritourism businesses. They have limited access to business development tools and a lack of tailored marketing support. This AI-powered agritourism kit is a great way to fill those gaps and to deal with challenges faced by these agritourism stakeholders because it can provide accessible and proven solutions to support rural entrepreneurship."

After learning that many farmers and ranchers don't have smart phones, Dong decided to develop the toolkit as a website, so there is no need to download an app to be able to use it. The toolkit includes five interactive modules: business planning, marketing strategy, risk management, compliance check, and impact assessment, plus an AI-powered chatbot.

For her work, Dong was honored as the 2025 national and regional winner in the education technology category for the National Association of Community Development Extension Professionals. Those prestigious awards recognize groundbreaking work in leveraging AI to empower rural communities.

Dong received initial funding for the project in the fall of 2024 from the CSU Extension Food Systems Program and Research Unit which supported the development of the Toolkit and its core chatbot functionality. She was also awarded two additional grants to further enhance her project, one from the Western Rural Development Center (WRDC) Fellows Program and another from the Western Sustainable Agriculture Research and Education (WSARE) Professional Development Program.



Throughout the accolades, promotions, and recognition, Dong remains steadfast in her mission from day one: to make a difference in the communities she serves. "Through the easy access tool, business planning and expert insight, the toolkit can lower the actual barriers of rural agritourism operators," Dong noted. "It enhances operational efficiency and also simplifies the decision making processes. That's my goal and that's how I aim to help more agritourism businesses in rural communities."

Some people enroll in college and then life ends up taking them down a different path. While some who experience this may not see the benefit of returning to school, CSU Global alumna Colleen Lazanich proves earning a degree is valuable, no matter what stage of your career you are in.



Lazanich originally started pursuing her degree early on in life but then decided to take a step back and focus on work to take care of her family. “I had children young, so I was working and ended up finding great success within my job,” she shared. “I just got super busy with life and always said I would go back and finish when my daughter was in college.” As time went on, Lazanich confessed that she wasn’t sure if going back to school was necessary. However, her mindset started to shift when a change in management occurred at her company that presented new challenges. Lazanich decided that it was time to change jobs and realized receiving her degree would help. “Searching for a job at my career level without a college degree was super challenging, so I decided to go back to school,” she said.

Lazanich knew going to school online would be the best approach in helping her obtain her degree successfully. “Doing it online was the only thing that really made sense for me because I was working full-time and had a family,” she noted. “I researched online universities and wanted one that had a really good program. **When I looked into CSU Global, I saw that they focused on veterans and on people who were already working, and it was really clear that their programs meant more than just a mail-in certificate.**”

Lazanich chose to enroll in CSU Global’s B.S. in Business Management program and minor in Organizational Leadership. Her classes helped her overcome the challenges she was facing at work. “Since I was studying organizational leadership, a lot of my papers were centered around my business and working life, so it helped me process a lot of what was going on,” she shared. “My classes also helped me become even more self-aware and look at what was happening from an outside point of view.”

In 2016, Lazanich graduated, and five years later she took a job at CalNonprofits Insurance Services where she is currently the CEO. She took the job because she was excited

by the opportunity to impact people’s lives through her work. “The company I had left unhappily was an insurance carrier for non-profit organizations, and I really missed working with the non-profits and adding another level of purpose to what I did in my life,” she explained.

As soon as she came onboard, Lazanich began to transform the company in a positive way. “Immediately it was clear that the culture in the organization wasn’t great and technologically they were way behind,” she noted. “I’m really proud of the 180-degree transformation we achieved. We ended up winning a National Technology in Insurance award. Culturally, we flipped the script and built a very inclusive organization, and we grew 14% last year with staff growing at about the same rate.”

Lazanich is excited to continue to grow the company and lead it through successful goal completion over the next few years. She credits CSU Global for helping her clinch her current role.

“I don’t know that they would’ve selected me as the CEO without my degree,” she noted.

Lazanich also emphasized that continuing her education was well worth it. “A lot of people would’ve asked why at that point in your career, when you were already a VP, would you not just coast through the rest of it? But the insights I gained from my classes were invaluable for this role. Even if you’re at a later point in your career like I was, it’s still worth it to earn your degree. I enjoyed all of my classes and I learned something in every class!”

Honoring Those Who Serve

Since its inception, CSU Global has served the needs of modern post-traditional learners – many of whom are military personnel – and has since become a top-ranked online institution for service members. In fact, in 2025, U.S. News & World Report ranked CSU Global as the top Colorado institution on their list of Best Online Bachelor's Programs for Veterans and no. 4 overall.

CSU Global offers special discounted tuition rates for active-duty service members, guard, and reserves, veterans, and their spouses and dependents. It also has the policies and processes in place for external credit review and transferability towards its certificates and degrees. Additionally, CSU Global's Military Friendliness Academic Policy

encourages students to reach out about their obligations so arrangements can be made to help them complete their coursework whenever and wherever their work takes them. To further create avenues for relationships in its fully online environment, service member students and alumni are also encouraged to join the CSU Global Student Veterans Organization.

We welcome students to utilize their VA benefits at CSU Global and are proud to participate in the VA Principles of Excellence Program. CSU Global also offers a streamlined application process and waived application fees for military and veteran students, as well as their families.



Expanding Opportunities for Colorado Learners with Technical School and College Partnerships

In 2025, CSU Global formed several new partnerships with technical schools and colleges to expand accessible options for Colorado students to earn a bachelor's or master's degree. The University collaborated with Emily Griffith Technical College (Emily Griffith) on a process for students to earn a fully online bachelor's degree as they advance from Emily Griffith's career and technical education (CTE) certificate programs. Eligible Emily Griffith Computer

Networking and Accounting students are offered guaranteed admission to CSU Global Bachelor's in Computer Science or Bachelor's in Accounting. CSU Global also partnered with Colorado Mountain College (CMC), offering eligible CMC undergraduate students a seamless pathway to continue their education online at CSU Global in the areas of business, leadership, and education through guaranteed admissions to select master's programs and special tuition rates.



CSU Global alum, backcountry skier, and neuroscientist Denny Schaedig built an AI solution to better predict avalanche risk. "It could help people be more informed... Maybe even save lives," said Schaedig. The effort began as part of a capstone project for his M.S. in Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning degree. Schaedig credits CSU Global's fully online environment with allowing him to live and work in the mountains and be able to do research in the surrounding areas.

In 2025, CSU Global's online Graduate Certificate in Education Leadership-Principal Licensure was fully reauthorized by the State of Colorado. The program is the only 100% online, asynchronous program of its kind to be authorized by the State, providing an accessible option for educators who need the flexibility to accommodate their busy schedules while gaining the necessary credential to become a principal. Signaling the University's commitment to helping educators in Colorado advance their careers, the program prepares learners with the necessary skills and knowledge for an assistant principal or principal role at elementary, middle,

or high schools. Educators gain the tools needed to coordinate daily school activities, oversee curricula, and maintain a safe and productive learning environment.

Committed to providing affordable upskilling opportunities to educators, CSU Global also partnered with the Colorado BOCES Association in 2025, providing special tuition rates of *almost 50% off its teaching and learning programs* to educators across the state. Through the partnership, educators in 163 school districts in Colorado have access to these reduced rates.
